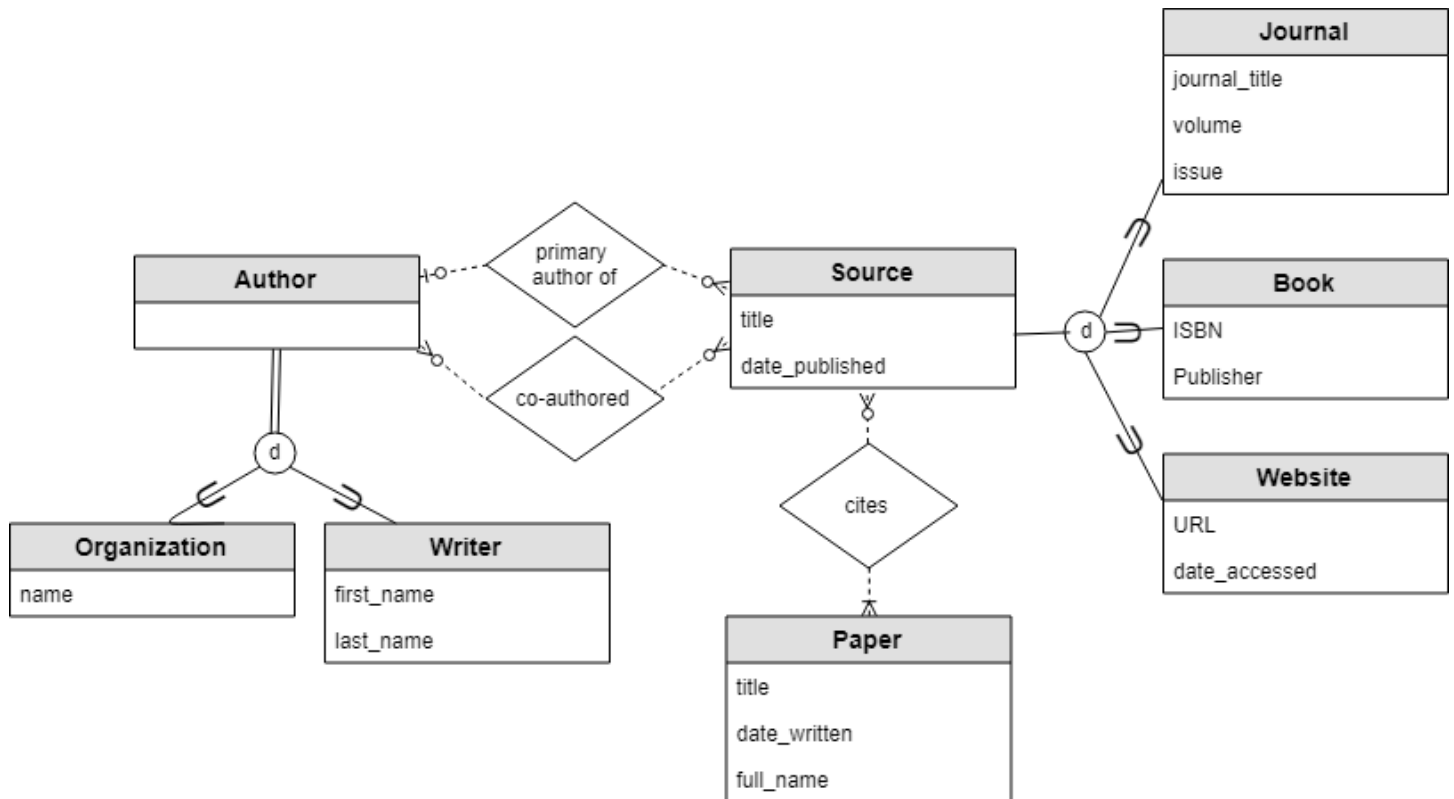


Research Paper Citation Project
