COLOR BLINDNESS: MEET MR. LEE



- He has difficulty reading the text on many websites.
- Seems like text and images use poor color contrast all using similar shades of brown.
- In some cases, the site instructions explained that discounted prices were indicated by red text, but all of the text looked brown to him.
- In other cases, the required fields on forms were indicated by red text, but again he could not tell which fields had red text.

COLOR BLINDNESS: SOLUTION?




- Use sufficient color contrast, and redundant information for color.
 - If you are going to show colors of clothing, include names of the colors of clothing as well as showing a sample of the color
 - Add text cues such as an asterisk to discounted prices in addition to showing them in a different color
 - Clearly indicate required fields on a form in addition to indicating them by color.
- A user can also define customized color combinations for text, links, and the background and/or utilize high color contrast settings in a web browser.
 - However, this approach does not work for all websites, such as those that are not coded to allow readers to override the default presentation of the website.

COLOR BLINDNESS: IDEAS




- Customized fonts and colors: Use font types, sizes, colors, spacing to make text easier to read
- Easy-to-read text: Simplify summaries for passages of text to help make it easier to understand.
- Document outline: Represent content that to prominently show headings and relevant structures to help provide orientation and an overview of the contents.



COLOR BLINDNESS: IDEAS



- Progressive disclosure: Design technique that involves showing only the least amount of information or functions necessary for a given task or purpose, to avoid overloading the user with information.
- Reduced interface: Represent the content that only shows most relevant info or more frequently used functions; for instance, by hiding other parts of the content that can distract users.

We have accepted less privacy


CALCULATE THOSE CONTRASTS

- Use contrast calculators, e.g., <u>http://www.msfw.com/Services</u> /ContrastRatioCalculator
- How does this page fare?
 - The <u>lightest</u> background color compared to the <u>darkest</u> font color gets a 4.5 : 1 contrast ratio.
 - This is right on the borderline, but then consider the <u>average</u> background color compared to the <u>average</u> font color!

BLINDNESS MEET MR. GILBERT



- To use his computer and the Web, Mr. Gilbert uses:
 - Screen reader software that interprets what is displayed on the screen and generates speech output
 - Web browser with keyboard support to help use websites without a mouse
- He uses the keyboard to navigate websites, often by jumping from heading to heading to get an overview of what is on a web page.
- His screen reader indicates the structural information on a web page such as headings, column and row headings in tables, list items, links, form controls, and more.
- However, when websites are not coded properly and do not include structural information, Mr. Gilbert would have to read every web page from top to bottom to find the information that he needs. This is unmanageable and she avoids such websites where she can, both for leisure and for business.

TEXT BROWSERS As Test Environment

HEADERS ATTRIBUTE

- id="e" → Exams
- id="e1" → 1
 (Associated with "e", hence "Exam 1")
- Associated with "e e1", hence "Exam 1 15%")

Now it is easy for a screen reader to see what Exam 1 is worth.







 - While it conveys a lot of information visually, it is lost on Mr. Gilbert.



No DISTRACTIONS FOR SCREEN READERS

- "Distraction" any of a number of Web page conventions which can interfere with a screen reader operation, keyboard operation or cause significant reading issues for people with multiple cognitive or neurological disorders.
- Distractions include the following:
 - Videos playing automatically
 - Continuous background audio
 - Continuous slideshows
 - Scrolling text or text that disappears/changes
 - Pop up ads
 - Blinking objects/flashing lights

PDF IS NOT THE MOST ACCESSIBLE FORMAT

- Full version of Adobe Acrobat needed to insert and inspect
 ALT text and other accessibility accommodations in PDF files.
- Harder to make PDF forms accessible than HTML forms.
- PDFs consisting of scanned pages are really a series of images, and therefore inaccessible to screen readers.
 - Only an OCR (optical character reader) scanner can save a scanned document as a text file.
- The interface between a browser and a PDF file is not consistent across platforms and browsers.

Consider:

- Posting in PDF and native formats like Word or PowerPoint
- Taking extra steps to make accessible PDFs

ACCOMMODATING THE HARD OF HEARING



- She had little trouble with the University curriculum until the university upgraded their online material to a multimedia approach, using an extensive collection of audio lectures.
- For classroom-based lectures the university provided sign language interpreters and CART writers (professionals typing what is being said verbatim).
- However, for web-based instruction, they initially did not realize that accessibility was an issue, then said they had no idea how to provide the material in accessible format.



Accessibility guideline


Use labels with radio buttons and check boxes and other controls so the user can click on the label text to select the control that the label is associated with. This also helps assistive devices.

• Shift + Esc (to see a list of access keys)

Setting a proper tab order and providing access keys improves the accessibility for users who can't use a mouse.



Also note that for hyperlinks, sometimes quick access invokes the link, whereas

other times it might just set the focus on the link. (Ain't diversity grand?)

CSS: HOVER AND FOCUS

Accessibility guideline

- Apply the same formatting to the :hover and :focus pseudo-classes for an element.
- That way, those who can't use the mouse will have the same experience as those who can.






IMAGE ALT TEXT VIEWER






