    - g. Activity diagrams
- 4. Design document judged for
  - a. Complete coverage
  - b. Inclusion of design specifications
  - c. Whether UML conforms to standards
  - d. Traceability
  - e. Well organized

- 5. Validation plan judged for
  - a. Inclusion of traceability matrix
  - b. Risk analysis
  - c. Discussion of team's testing strategy
  - d. Coverage of non-functional requirements
